Record 4,000 Jewish Athletes To Participate In 12th Maccabiah

record 4,000 athletes, in 50 years. representing Jewish communities from 35 countries, will participate in the 12th Maccabiah games due to open in the Ramat 15.



"One Man Plus The Truth Constitutes A Majority"

With Lebanon's terrorists riding high in the news lately, King Hussein's Middle East peace proposals have been pushed to the background. However, once American and Israeli anger and dismay over the Shiite air hijacking outrage lessens (if ever it does), Jordan's flawed proposition will be scrutinized anew.

The recent death in England of the colorful unpredictable Lord and George-Brown dramatized the importance of UN Security Council Resolution 242, adopted in late 1967; for it was George-Brown who is credited with the authorship of 242, calling for Arab recognition of Israel's right to exist in exchange for Israeli withdrawal from occupied territory.

Before and after that 1967 milestone in diplomatic history was recorded, plans for Middle East peace have marched across the news terrain without any noticeable success. (The one exception resulted in the Israeli-Egyptian Camp David compact; and Messrs. Sadat, Begin, and Carter sweated blood to bring that forth.) As long ago as 1969, we had the Rogers plan. Proposed by then State Secretary William P. Rogers, this design called upon Israel to give up Sinai, which it did eventually, and to yield the West Bank to Jordan along with the Gaza Strip to the Arabs. It called also for placing Jerusalem under joint Israeli-Jordanian or international control. Placing a still heavier burden on Israel, Rogers held that all of the Palestinians heeding the advice of Israel's attackers, must eventually be absorbed by Israel. He threw in a demand for binding Arab commitments to peace. To date, any such commitments have eluded the knowledge of man.
