Argentine Jewish Institutions Target Of Arsonists

BUENOS AIRES (WNS) - Four arson attempts against Jewish institutions in Rosario have badly shaken the 12,000-member Jewish community in that city, the second largest in Argentina.

According to the World Jewish Congress here, all four attempts occurred over a short period of time. The most recent targeted the Bikur Cholim, a charitable institution which provides medical services distributes medicine free to Jewish and non-Jewish poor. It followed by only a few days attempted arson at the Sephardic synagogue in Rosario.
