Nathan Adelson Hospice To Host Regional Conference

Regional hospice conference awarded to Las Vegas' Nathan Adelson Hospice program.

The Southern Pacific Region of the National Hospice Organization will hold its eighth annual conference in Las Vegas in the spring of 1986. According to Clair Tehan, NHO spokesperson, the 1986 conference will be the first time that the regional meeting will be held outside of California. The Southern Pacific Region includes more than 200 hospices in five western states.

The Nathan Adelson Hospice will be the official host for the regional conference. "We are delighted with the NHO South Pacific Region vote to hold the 1986 conference in Las Vegas," said NAH Executive Administrator Buck Deadrich. "Hosting an important working hospice conference here speaks well for the Clark County medical community and the Nathan Adelson Hospice program. Our program is receiving increasing regional and national recognition," continued Deadrich. "It's certainly a positive thing for all Las Vegas to see such a humanitarian program gaining national attention. This is a wonderful city and national recognition of our cultural, intellectual and humanitarian aspects is long overdue."

Argentina Will Not Allow PLO Office In Buenos Aires

BUENOS AIRES (WNS) — The Palestine Liberation Organization will not be allowed to open an office in Buenos Aires, a ranking government official told Jewish leaders here. But Argentina will not move its embassy in Israel from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem.

Those two stands, though not related, reflect the even-handed approach the Argentine regime is seeking to adopt toward the Middle East. It was explained in some detail by Deputy Foreign Minister Jorge Sabato in an address to the monthly public affairs forum of B'nai B'rith Argentina.

Sabato indicated that the government of President Raul Alfonsin strongly supports the rights of the Palestinian and equally strongly supports Israel's right to exist as an independent state.

Argentina, he said, does not accept the equation of Zionism with racism or those who would have Israel labeled by the United Nations as a "non-peace loving nation." At the same time, it does not approve certain Israeli actions such as the bombing of Iraq's nuclear facility in 1981.

Secretary of State Argentina Dio who was present at the meeting, pointed out that there were both Jewish and Arab communities in Argentina and the government is interested in their harmonious coexistence. Asked if Argentina would transfer its Embassy to Jerusalem as Costa Rica and El Salvador have done, he replied emphatically, "No."

"Since we moved frequently, I got to know a lot of different folks. That helps me now to entertain them," says Tucker.

The most beneficial move was to Las Vegas, the "Entertainment Capital of the World."

It was in Las Vegas that Tucker and her father, Beau, met CBS A&R whiz Billy Sherrill, who already had a hand in sculpting the careers of Tammy Wynette, George Jones and Charlie Rich. With Sherrill's guidance, Tucker released "Delta Dawn" and became a "star" at the age of 13.

A string of hits followed including "San Antonio Stroll," "You've Got Me To Hold Onto," "Cowboy Lovin' Night," "Feel Right," "Can I See You Tonight?" and "Changes."

Currently Tucker is working on a new album and has gone back to her country roots and former producer, Jerry Crutchfield, who also works with Lee Greenwood. The single and album are due out in the fall.
