The Zulu leader, representing some six million Zulus in South Africa, said Israel need not sever diplomatic ties with South Africa, although he urged an arms boycott in order to pressure for reforms in South Africa.

Buthelezi told reporters at a news conference at Ben Gurion Airport that while there has been some anti-Jewish unrest in South Africa, the Zulus have maintained good relations with the Jewish community there. He is scheduled to meet with Peres, President Chaim Herzog and Foreign Minister Yitzhak Shamir.
