VIENNA (WNS) — Israel will not be allowed to participate in next year's chess Olympiad in the United Arab Emirates because the World Chess Federation's General Assembly decided last year to hold the tournament in Dubai, which has since refused entry permits to Israeli players. The UAE said it did not grant the permits because Israel and the UAE are in a state of conflict.

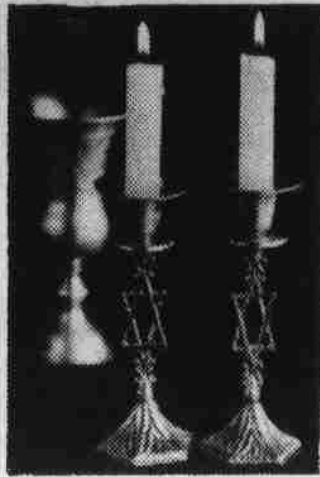
BONN (WNS) — Chancellor Helmut Kohl has congratulated the Jewish community in Augsburg on the reopening of the synagogue there, destroyed during the notorious Kristallnacht of 1938. "Your temple may be in the diaspora but you...are here at home," Kohl said in a cable. Augsburg is one of the oldest cities in Germany, and is celebrating its 2,000th anniversary.

JERUSALEM (WNS) — Six people were slightly injured when a bomb exploded in a bus in Gilo, a suburb of Jerusalem. They were rushed to a hospital and released several hours later after being treated for their injuries and shock. Police detained 11 suspects. The bomb was planted in a bush near the bus stop.

WASHINGTON (WNS) — Rabbi Arthur Schneier, president of the Appeal of Conscience Foundation, proposed during a speech to the National Press Club here a summit conference of religious leaders from all over the world to help stem the spread of religious fanaticism which, he said, is causing intolerance, terror and persecution. Schneier, an Orthodox rabbi and head of the Park East synagogue in New York, said the Appeal of Conscience Foundation would set up a 12-member steering committee by the end of the year to organize the conference which he hopes would be held in 1986.

NEW YORK (WNS) — More than 1,100 synagogues in the United States, and Canada will take part in the 5746/1985 Israel Bond High Holy Day Appeals to help mobilize funds to assist Israel in overcoming its economic crisis. Bond dollars help provide jobs for Israelis, especially in the development towns, as well as research and development funds for the nation's high technology industries.

JERUSALEM (WNS) — The new school year began on schedule, after an 11th hour agreement between the teachers union and Education Minister Yitzhak Navon averted a threatened strike. The teachers agreed to take a 1.5 percent cut in salary. In exchange, the Education Ministry will reinstate 700 of the 1,800 non-tenured teachers who were dismissed in July.

NEW YORK (WNS) — Three women were awarded the Medal of Righteous for risking their lives and the lives of their families to help Jews during the Holocaust in Europe. The recipients of the awards were Jean Berger of Yonkers, New York, who saved Jews in the Ukraine; Sophie Ebro-Prokosh of Paterson, New Jersey, who saved Jews in Poland; and Konstanca Brasiniens of Lithuania, who died in 1970 who was represented by her daughter. The awards were presented by Israeli Consul General Naphtali Lavie in a simple but emotional ceremony at the Israeli Consulate here.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) — King Hussein of Jordan will come to New York to address the United Nations General Assembly on September 27, only a few days before Israeli Premier Shimon Peres is scheduled to address the General Assembly on October 2. Peres is scheduled to continue on to Washington after his New York visit to meet with President Reagan and other U.S. administration officials.



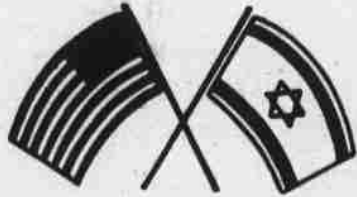
