Israeli Envoy Gunned Down In Cairo

Albert Atrakchi, the Israel Embassy Administrative Attache in Cairo, assassinated on his way to work, was buried in the military section of the Kirvat Shaul cemetery here.

Foreign Minister Yitzhak Shamir, who spoke at the graveside, said Atrakchi "was a faithful and dedicated servant of the state, like his father Yacov." Atrakchi's father was an Iragi Jew hanged after the Six-Day War for being a Zionist.

Atrakchi, 30, served in the Israel Defense Forces for 10 years before being posted to Cairo several months ago. He was shot to death while in his car with his wife and the wife of another Embassy diplomat, both of whom were injured. They were driving from their homes in the Mahdi suburb of Cairo to the Embassy.

According to one ; report, a red Fiat car with three men had been following the diplomat's car. As the Fiat pulled up
