Italian Comedy Tumbling Act Makes Changes For U.S. Audiences

The Trio Bogis, an Italian comedy tumbling act featured in the Las Vegas Hilton's "Bal du Moulin Rouge," has had to make some changes in their act since coming to the United States to perform.

The three brothers in the act, Leandro, Fabio and Marco, are the third generation in their family to perform in circuses and shows, but they are the first family members ever to appear in this country.

"It's a different type of humor over here," says Fabio. "In Europe, it's almost entirely visual comedy, but over here you can do joke lines. You can work with the audience more in this country."

The difference is that in Europe the Trio Bogis' type of act is confined almost exclusively to circuses, whereas in the U.S., their type of performers work more in stage settings.

"Here the audience is right in front of you and they can hear everything you say," he says. "I

like talking to people."

Fabio says the comedy tumbling and acrobatic team changed their act for the stage also. Their performance is now eight minutes long, as opposed to only five minutes long when they performed with circuses. "We've added some more comedy and other tricks."

No matter where they perform, however, audiences are alike in one respect, he adds. It takes them a few minutes to get used to their act.

"Our act contains a lot of tumbling combined with comedy-like stunts," he says. "We use a lot of slaps and kicks, but it's all fake. Many people think it's real, but after awhile, they realize it is supposed to be like that."


