Anti-Semitic Acts Rise In Canada

TORONTO (WNS) — Acts of harassment and vandalism against Jews in Canada increased by more than 162 percent between 1983 and 1984, according to a report by the B'nai B'rith League for Human Rights.

The annual review of anti-Semitism released says there were 126 anti-Semitic incidents reported to the League

last year compared with 48 such incidents in 1983. Almost all the incidents of vandalism and harassment occurred in metropolitan areas in the provinces of Quebec and Ontario, the report said. Quebec had the highest number of anti-Semitic acts, with 27 incidents of harassment and 40 of vandalism.

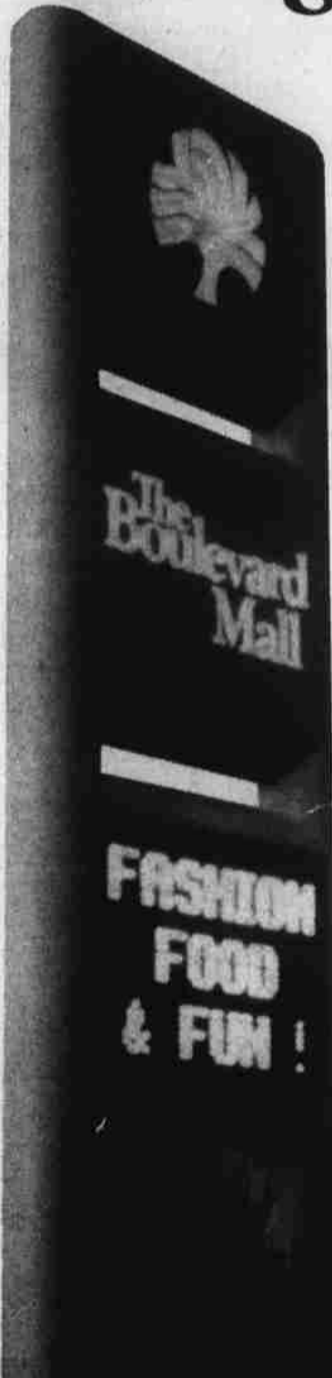

The dramatic rise in reported incidents may, however, be the result of a greater willingness

to report such acts. "We may have to wait till we get the 1985 results to see if there is a pattern occurring here or whether this year's findings are just a blip on the screen," said Alan Shefman, a B'nai B'rith spokesman.
