

### Danny Gale Debuts In D. I. Lounge



Danny Gale, who sings, dances, does impressions and plays a variety of musical instruments, joins the line-up in the Desert Inn's Raffles Lounge through October 7. Gale, who has been called a cross between Tom Jones and Englebert Humperdinck, and his band will appear nightly except Sunday.

The Desert In Country Club and Spa welcomes Danny Gale and Company as they debut in the Raffles lounge now through October 7.

Gale, called "an entertainer's entertainer" by Variety Show Business Magazine, and "a cross between Tom Jones and Englebert Humperdinck" by the Miami Herald, sings, dances and plays the bass guitar, banjo, trumpet and piano. He also does impressions of Elvis Presley and Johnny Cash.

The Company consists of singer and saxophone player Suzette Done, guitarist Conrad Trevino, drummer Ray Lopez and keyboard player and singer Tom Cranford.

The group sings all varieties of music. Gale describes their sets as a variety show with complete singing, dancing and comedy.

Originally from Milwaukee, Wis., Gale grew up with music and dance as his parents owned and operated a music and dance school.

His first professional job was as bassist with Little Artie of the Pharoahs. From there, he went to work with top local show bands. After a few years of this, he decided to make his "move."

"I said, 'That's it.' I was going by myself to Los Angeles and make it -- on my own, no friends, relatives or old acquaintances," recalls Gale.

Gale moved from behind the bass to center stage where he developed his show and added a band. With his new format, he played in nightclubs in Florida, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Wisconsin and Texas.

Since his arrival in Las Vegas in 1981, he's played at the Barbary Coast, Dunes, Frontier and MGM.

### ADL Blasts FCC

NEW YORK, N.Y. — A national Jewish leader called the Federal Communications Commission action regarding the license renewal of a Kansas radio station charged with broadcasting anti-Semitism and threats of violence "a detour around the FCC's legal obligation to serve the public interest."

Nathan Perlmutter, national director of the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith, said that "the Commission's refusal to designate these violence-inciting anti-Semitic broadcasts an issue in the renewal proceedings strains credibility."

The full text of Mr. Perlmutter's statement follows:

"The Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith views today's action by the Federal Communications Commission regarding the license renewal application of radio station KTTL-FM of Dodge City, KS, a detour around the FCC's legal obligation to serve the public interest. The FCC is sending a dangerous message that it will tolerate broadcasts characterized by virulent anti-Semitism, racism and incitement to violence against Jews and other minorities.

"Broadcasts which urge listeners to 'get violent, start making dossiers, names, addresses, phone numbers, car license numbers, on every damn Jew rabbi in this land, and every Anti-Defamation League leader...(to) get these roadblock locations, where you can set up ambushes, and get it all working now' must be grounds for refusing to renew a station's license to broadcast. The Commission's refusal to designate these violence-inciting anti-Semitic broadcasts an issue in the renewal proceedings strains credibility. By any standard of public interest, of democratic fairness, of plain common sense, KTTL does not merit a broadcast license.

"The Anti-Defamation League does not regard the FCC action as the final word on this matter. The issue of the content of KTTL's broadcasts must be raised before the administrative law judge. There will be future legal proceedings, and ADL plans to be involved."


