

amount on the receipt by bringing them to the Redemption Booth, set up in the center Mall entrance by Orange Julius. The booth will be set up October 17-19 during Mall hours.

4) The minimum denomination of "Boulevard Bucks" is 55; however, several receipts can be combined to total 55.

5) All customers wishing to participate in the Auction must register with the auctioneer on Sunday, October 20 between 10 A.M. - 1 P.M. in the center court of the Mall.

6) To register, the customer must have ON HAND all validated receipts equaling the amount of "Boulevard Bucks" and identification in order to obtain a numbered bidder card.

IDF Raids 3 Lebanese Shiite Towns

TEL AVIV (WNS) -The Israel Defense Force carried search operations in three Lebanese villages at the edge of the security zone, according to reports from Tyre. The IDF troops in tanks and armored personnel carriers, rounded up villagers in an area a few miles from a suicide-car bombing in search for terrorists. The bombing was the seventh such attack on Israeli troops or the South Israeli-backed Lebanon Army since June.

Defense Minister Yitzhak Rabin told Israel Radio that the IDF activities in south Lebanon designed to impress on members of the Shiite Amal living in the area that Israel would not allow them to act against Israel in the security zone. He said: "We wanted to make it clear, by signalling to the Amal forces, that we are not going to tolerate any extension of the struggle over the security zone into Israel. And this was the purpose for the siege on the village of Kabrikha, which is the nearest village to the area from where Katyushas were fired against targets in Israel," last weekend.

The IDF spokesman announced that the army operated as in the villages of Baath Party.

Majel Silk and Shakra because they had been the areas from which the Katyushas had been fired. Military sources said that quantitles of arms and explosives had found in the villages. They included Katyushas and rocket launchers, as well as road side charges ready to be laid.

The house in which the explosives were found was destroyed, and several residents were detained. They will presumably be handed over to the SLA.

Meanwhile, reports from Sidon said that a large car-bomb had exploded near a South Lebanon Army (SLA) post near Jezzine in south Lebanon, parently killing the terrorist driver and wounding at least two SLA soldiers. It was believed that some 300 kilograms of explosives had been packed into the vehicle, and the sound of the explosion was heard in Sidon some 14 kilometers away. According to reports from Beirut, about 15 SLA men and Lebanese civilians had been injured in the blast.

A beirut television broadcast reported that the terrorist had been a member of the "Assad Brigade," said to be part of the Lebanese Kabrikha village as well branch of the Syrian
