





While California goes nuts on the Lottery, Las Vegas notes the millions won in slot machine jackpots over the past fortnight. First there was PATRICIA MASON, auto saleswoman from Hallendale, Fla., winning \$1,023,631 at the Frontier, while Dallas bank teller ANN BAILEY plunked \$9 into a progressive Golden Nugget slot a few days later and won \$1,804,268. Meanwhile at the Las Vegas Hilton a fey character, 83-year-old DANIEL MAYHOEFER of L.A., calling himself "King of Slot Machines" won \$2,250,000 playing four \$25 slots at one time. "I've never seen anything like it," Hilton slot manager, CECIL FREDI commented on the Frey outlay. "Never in the history of Las Vegas slot machine play has anyone put in so much money in nonprogressive slots and gotten so much money back." He said that Mayhoefer "is responsible for 90% of the money played and has won 98% of the money paid out." PATRICIA MASON fed \$388 into her slot machine after promising change girl JOAN MIRKO she would buy her a car of her choice if the jackpot hit. MASON has also been doling out her winnings to other people around town down in their luck. As for the 62-year-old grandma from

Dallas, Golden Nugget owner STEVE WYNN asked her if she was going to cease gambling now that she was a millionaire. BAILEY's frank reply caused laughs from GN staffers and media when she replied, "No, but I may guit work." That was a refreshing admission. Most millionaire winners say they'll keep right on working.


