

The Las Vegas Hilton race and sports book will begin construction that is expected to be on a plush \$15 million completed by the Fall

of 1986, according to an adjacent to the main announcement by entrance and the easy Barron Hilton, chairman, president and chief executive officer of Hilton Hotels Corporation.

The new 30,500 square-foot facility will also include a poker room, an Italian deli, a lounge and restaurant.

In addition to this, the expansion will include a remodeled slot gallery complete with unique special effects. Officials at the resort feel that the new slot concept will become a tourist attraction in itself.

The book, which will be located on the resort's east side, will provide convenient access for customers to the facility.
