Howard Hughes' 1954 Chrysler New Yorker is one of more than 200 antique and classic automobiles on display in the Imperial Palace Auto Collection.

The billionaire recluse, Howard Hughes, bought a 1954 Chrysler New Yorker brand new and immediately had it altered to his peculiar specifications. Because he had a phobic fear of germs, he had a \$15,000 air purification system installed and had all but the driver's window permanently sealed. The unique purification system is intact in the trunk today. At the time of his death, the car was still titled to Hughes Productions in Florida. The odometer registers just 1,533 miles.

Hughes' Chrysler is one of more than 200 cars on display in the multi-million dollar Imperial Palace Auto Collection. Among antiques and classics are also cars once owned by historical figures including Adolf Hitler, Al Capone, the King of Siam, Eleanor Roosevelt, and a parade phaeton used by President Eisenhower.

The Collection, located on the fifth floor of the hotel's parking facility, is open daily from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 p.m.

3,501 DUI Arrests Made Since January In Southern Nevada

Southern Nevada law enforcement officers arrested 3,501 drivers for driving under the influence (DUI) from January 1 to August 31. The Metropolitan Police Department led arrests with 1,562 offenders; Nevada Highway Patrol apprehended 1,391 drivers; Henderson Police Department recorded 372 DUI charges, followed by North Las Vegas Police Department with 155 cases. Boulder City Police Department had the least—reporting only 21 arrests.
