Smith Moves To Block Arms Sale To Jordan

Congressman Larry Smith (D-Fla.) initiated a "Dear Colleague" letter aimed at blocking the Administration's attempt to sell advanced aircraft and air defense systems to Jordan. The letter was jointly signed by House Foreign Affairs Committee Chairman Dante Fascell (D-Fla.) and ten other Members of Congress.

"Direct bilateral negotiations are the best method to reach a peace settlement," wrote Smith. "When direct negotiations between Jordan and Israel actually go forward, then Congress should consider our most advanced weapons now, what incentive would Jordan have to further the peace process?"

The letter is based on an amendment to this year's foreign aid bill, also sponsored by Smith, which declares that if the President submits to Congress a Jordanian arms sale of advanced aircraft or new air defense systems, he must also certify Jordan's public commitment to negotiate promptly and directly with Israel under the basic tenets of U.N. Security Council Resolution 242 and 338.

Smith, along with other Members of Congress supporting the bill, do not think the President can issue such a certification. "I have heard nothing new from King Hussein in the past week," said Smith, "and I do not believe he has made any significant movement toward entering into direct negotiations with Israel."
