Hilton Returns To Special Events Promotion; Amos To Direct Efforts



The Las Vegas Hilton has marked a return to promoting special events at the resort with the appointment of veteran promotions and public relations consultant, Ron Amos, to director of special events, it was announced by Barron Hilton, chairman, president and chief executive officer of Hilton Hotels Corporation.

Amos came to the Hilton from Ron Amos Enterprises, Inc., a Las Vegas based consultant company which he formed in 1979.

The Las Vegas Hilton will initiate its schedule of events with a welterweight title unification match-up between WBA and IBF champion, Donald Curry, and WBC champ Milton McCrory, on December 6 in the 70,000 square-foot Hilton Center. Future events will be held in the Hilton Center and the 48,000 square-foot Hilton Pavilion, which was originally constructed for this purpose in 1977.

"Our goal," Hilton said, "is to re-establish ourselves as an innovator in these important areas."

In his new position, Amos will be in charge of booking, supervising and promoting sports and special events.

He is a 27-year resident of Las Vegas. Amos previously served as director of promotion and special events at the Las Vegas Hilton between 1977-1979. He was instrumental in setting up the 1978 Muhammad Ali-Leon Spinks world heavyweight championship and numerous other major sports events.

His experience also includes director of public relations for Caesars Palace and sports editor for both the Las Vegas Sun and Las Vegas Review-Journal. He is also the recipient of several, local, state and national writing awards, including being elected Nevada "Sportswriter of the Year" for four consecutive years in the annual National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Awards balloting and serving on the NSSA board of directors in 1965-66, also an elected position. 
Page Fifteen "Bo" The Soldier Of Fortune Poster Girl Is A Las Vegan
