world there is diversity, pluralism, and coexistence, but it is only in the Middle East where the lesson of Maccabean freedom to be one'sself was first taught that it will have to be relearned all over again.

Much of the Western world has still not realized that the massacres and agonies of Lebanon are directly linked to Arab-Islamic rejection of the Maccabean principle of religious freedom. Arab fanaticism will not tolerate an autonomous, strong Christian presence in Lebanon just as it struggles against a powerful, independent Jewish State in the Middle East.

When the Western Christian world -- including the Vatican -- realizes that the future security of Arab Christians ultimately depends on supporting Israel's struggle for pluralism, they will know that the Maccabees' message is as much their message today as it is the Jewish message.
