Box Office Open For "Nutcracker"



Tickets for NEVADA DANCE THEATRE's annual production of the "NUTCRACKER" are on sale at Artemus W. Ham Concert Hall box office.

Seventeen performances are scheduled at Judy Bayley Theatre, December 12 through 23, nightly at 8 p.m., plus matinees at 2 p.m. December 13, 15, 21, 22. Mervyn's is the principal sponsor of the "NUTCRACKER."

This production features all new scenery designed and executed by local artist Bill Meyer. His artistic imagination, meticulous eye for color and detail, and sensitivity to Vassili Sulich's concept makes this year's "NUTCRACKER" a more magical and beautiful spectacle than ever.

Last year's production was the beginning of a project to have all new costumes designed by Ballet West's Lavid Heuvel. This year the lavish new costuming will be complete.

Artistic Director Vassili Sulich has made a few choreographic changes. In particular, the "Debutantes" dance by tiny 6 year olds will now be an appearance by Snow White and the cutest

seven dwarfs. The original "NUTCRACKER" premiered in St. Petersburg, Russia in 1892. In Sulich's adaptation of the libretto, the first act of the ballet invites the audience to share the Christmas Eve celebration of the Village Mayor's family and friends, through the use of story-telling mime

and festive groups dances for both children and adults. The Mayor's daughter, Clara, is given a Nutcracker by her godfather, Dr. Drosselmeyer a magician who provides entertainment at the party. After the guests have left, Clara creeps downstairs, and falls asleep with the Nutcracker in her arms.

The audience is drawn into her magical dream. After the Nutcracker grows and saves her from invading mice, he comes to life as a Prince, who escorts her through the Snow Kingdom to the Kingdom of Toys. The Sugar Plum Fairy welcomes Clara to her Kingdom where she is entertained by dances of different countries. As

Christmas day dawns, Clara's dream continues as she is transported away from the Kingdom of Toys.

Tickets are \$15, \$10, \$6, children and senior citizens \$10, \$7, \$5. Discounts are available for groups of 20 or more. Box office hours are 12:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m., Monday through Saturday and one hour before performances. Patrons may charge tickets on either Visa or Mastercard. Guffawing In The Colosseum

A combination of some of the merriest have kept audiences laughing for 21 centuries, since they first set Romans to guffawing in the Colosseum in 200 B.C., is coming to the Union Plaza Hotel ber 24th.

This comedy, "A FUNNY THING HAPPENED ON THE WAY TO THE FORUM," scored a 28month run in New York from 1962 to 1964, brightened life for theatre goers in 44 other American cities, and toured London and Paris. And now it is coming to the Union Plaza where tradition of Broadway theatre is carried on in Las Vegas.

The musical's credentials go back a long way. Its tomfoolery has been drawn from a half dozen plays Plautus, rowdiest gagwriter in ancient Rome, whose slapstick comedies used to pack the Colosseum around 200 B.C. and have been boxoffice ever since, in adaptations by Shakespeare, Moilere, W.C. Fields. the Marx Brothers and countless burlesque comedians.

The plot of this Roman holiday is an unashamed medly of all the time-honored stock situations of farce-identities, mistaken masquerades. loves sweet loves and profane, the absurdities of an aging man still trying to be a Romeo, the desperate deceptions of a schemer always on the verge of being found out.

The tongue-in-cheek blending of the world's oldest and most surefire gags in "A FUNNY THING..." was accomplished by writers Burt Shevelove and Larry Gelbart, with music and lyrics by Stephen Sond-
