Peres: Israel Keeping Close Watch On Northern Borders

Israeli officials were quick to express surprise over a report in London-based Jane's Defense Weekly that Syrian forces were poised to attack Israel on the Golan Heights.

Their prompt reaction was intended to defuse the tension that the report itself could create. Defense Minis-Yitzhak Rabin stressed that contrary to Jane's report, which was headlined in the Israeli media, there has been no change in the deployment of Syrian forces facing the Golan Heights.

Officials admitted that there has been an escalation of tension in recent weeks since the Syrians moved SAM-2 surface-to-air missiles close to their border with Lebanon, posing a potential threat to Israel's reconnaissance flights over Lebanon. But this situation is hardly new. Israel has already conveyed a warning to Damascus, through the U.S., and the U.S. itself has cautioned both sides to exercise restraint.

Israeli leaders, senior army officers and researchers at the center for Strategic Studies have noted often in the past that Syria's defensive deployment along Golan Heights could very quickly be altered to an offensive But they posture. stress there is no indication the Syrians would effect such a change before they achieve their goal of strategic parity with Israel.

So far, the tension over the missile deployment has not spread to Golan Heights where the Syrians take pains to abide by the terms of the 1974 disengagement of forces agreement reached in the aftermath of the Yom Kippur War.




