## Second Kidnapped Beirut Jew Murdered By Shiite Terrorists

TEL AVIV (WNS) — The body of Isaac Tarrah, a 53-year-old Beirut Jew, was found in the Lebanese capital. He was one of four Beirut Jews kidnapped last March and the second to be murdered by Shiite Moslem extremists calling themselves "The Organization of the Oppressed of the World." The first victim was Haim Cohen Halala whose body was found in Beirut, recently.

The Shiite group announced that it "executed" Tarrah to avenge anti-Shiite acts by the Israel-backed South Lebanon Army (SLA), including the

demolition of houses in Kounin village in south Lebanon. The SLA blew up the houses from which two of its soldiers were killed in

an ambush last week that also wounded an Israel Defense Force Liaison officer. The families occupying the houses were evicted and expelled from the village.,

After Halala's body was found in the no-

man's-land between east and west Beirut, the same Shiite group announced "the execution of Israeli spy Haim Cohen Halala in response to the massive shelling of South Lebanon in which several strugglers were killed."
