Nazi War Criminals In U.S. To Be Deported

WASHINGTON (WNS) - The U.S. Board of Immigration Appeals has rejected the appeal of Reinhold Kulle, a former SS guard leader at the Gross-Rosen concentration camp who was ordered deported in 1984 by the Federal Immigration Court in Chicago. In a rare move, the Board of Immigration Appeals also took action that is expected to result in the cancellation of Kulle's social security

Kulle, 65, admitted during his 1983 trial that he had served during World War II as an officer in the "Totenkopf" (Death's Head) division of the Waffen-SS at the notorious Gross-Rosen camp in Upper Silesia.

In affirming the lower court's deportation order, the BIA noted that Kulle's SS service "primarily consisted of being a guard and training guards who made the brutal Nazi concentration camp system achieve its goals."
