



JERUSALEM (WNS) — King Hussein's announcement that he has ended his fruitless year-long efforts to bring the PLO into the peace process because of continued PLO intransigence was hailed by Israeli leaders as an "historic opportunity" for the Palestinian people to "take their fates into their own hands."

Premier Shimon Peres, speaking at Tel Aviv University, called on the Palestinians in the administered territories to "seize the moment." Defense Minister Yitzhak Rabin, in a television interview the same day, urged the Palestinians in the West Bank and Gaza Strip to cut themselves away from the PLO and "stand up for yourselves, take care of the 1.25 million Palestinians in the territories and join Hussein in a move to peace."

Peres, declaring that the prospects for peace have improved, summoned the Palestinians "to seize the moment." The Jordanian ruler, he said, did the right thing by "exposing the truth about the PLO" and "a great deal will now depend on the inhabitants of the occupied areas...will they let time pass, eating away at their fates, or will

"Empire Kosher Strikes Back" - Update

Just two weeks after the disastrous fire that caused upwards of 25 million dollars in damage at their Mifflintown, Pennsylvania poultry processing plant, Empire Kosher Poultry has released additional information about their current production plans and their rebuilding plans for the future.

Murry L. Katz, President of Empire Kosher, has reported the following facts concerning Empire's current production:

- Fresh chickens are available. All current orders are being filled and there is no shortage of fresh poultry.

 Turkey processing resumed at Empire's Mifflintown plant on Sunday, February 9, with delivery of turkeys to market resuming at the same time.

 Most cooked products (barbecue chickens, hot dogs, soups, chicken nuggets, fried chicken, etc.) are being made daily. Very few shortages of these products are expected.

 Retail packaged fresh-frozen products (legs, wings, breasts, cut-up, cornish, etc.) are being produced and shipped.

- Empire's line of non-poultry items have not been affected and supplies have not been interrupted.

Mr. Katz also emphasized that Empire expects no problems in being able to fill all orders for fresh, frozen and cooked items for the Passover

Supermarket officials in many areas have reported an increased demand for Empire products since the fire. In commenting on this increased demand, Mr. Katz stated that he expects the increased demand to continue and anticipates that the company will go through a new era of growth.

He said, "Empire has become world renowned for its high quality chicken, turkey and food products and even though we are now working to maintain as high a level of production as possible, we want to assure our customers that
