The Las Vegas Israelite Welcomes Aerojet Nevada To The Las Vegas Valley

Aerojet Nevada recently broke ground for a North Las Vegas manufacturing facility to be located on Losee Road just south of Craig Road. The 37,000 square feet facility will be used to manufacture metal parts for aerospace program and is slated for completion by the end of 1986.

State Senator Ray Shaffer, North Las Vegas City and Clark County officials as well as representatives from Nevada Development Authority were among those participating in the event.

Festivities also included the dedication of Aerojet Way, a street to be located in front of the new facility.

Conrad Ryan, Chairman of Nevada Development Authority presented Aerojet officials with a plaque to commemorate the event. Nevada Development Authority was instrumental in Aerojet Nevada's decision to locate in Southern Nevada.

The dedication, outside the Israeli Embassy in Washington, D.C., took place before a reception sponsored by the embassy and the Jewish National Fund of America, in cooperation with the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Federal Holiday Commission, the International Association of Official Human Rights Agencies, and the America-Israel Friendship League. Over 400 civil rights and religious leaders and elected officials attended the reception. The event marked the second consecutive year JNF held an event with the Israeli Embassy in honor of the slain civil rights leader. A memorial forest was dedicated by JNF in 1976 to honor King. The forest, located in Israel's Galilee, has now grown to over 10,000 trees.
