WASHINGTON (WNS) - Rep. Robert Dornan (R. Cal.) has indicated regret for remarks he made on the House floor last week which one major Jewish organization characterized as "anti-Semitic slander." Dornan, a member of the House Foreign Affairs Committee, who is known to be staunchly pro-Israel, acknowledged that he had used "inelegant phrasing" when he attacked Radio Moscow commentator Vladimir Posner who appeared on ABC TV after President Reagan's nationally televised speech seeking public support for his defense budget. Dorman expressed outrage that the Soviet commentator was allowed air time to rebut the President and called him "this disloyal, betraying little Jew." Posner is Jewish on his father's side, though the family had converted to the Russian Orthodox faith long before his birth.


