

Israeli Soldiers Wounded In Jordanian Border Incident Helped At Hadassah-Hebrew Medical Center

JERUSALEM — Ruth W. Popkin, National President of Hadassah, has just returned to the United States from Israel where she visited soldiers at Hadassah-Hebrew University Medical Center who were wounded in a recent incident on the Jordanian border in Wadi Haman.

The soldiers were wounded when an infiltrator carrying Jordanian army papers opened fire on an Israeli border patrol. Two Israeli soldiers were killed in the encounter.

Both soldiers were medically evacuated to Hadassah Medical Center by helicopter. One of the soldiers was Victor Bergrin, 22, who had emigrated from Miami to Israel with his parents 14 years ago. Victor had been wounded in the stomach, for which he underwent surgery, and

injured his left arm. Victor was clearly delighted to see Mrs. Popkin. "My mother was active in Hadassah in

Demjanjuk Says He Never Was In Treblinka

JERUSALEM (WNS) — Accused Nazi war criminal John Demjanjuk, who arrived in Israel after being extradited from the United States, was remanded in custody for 15 days by a Jerusalem court.

Demjanjuk, appearing before the court, again denied his involvement in the gassing of Jews at the Treblinka concentration camp -- as he has persistently done through the legal proceedings in the United States. He told the court, "I just want to say I am completely the wrong person." He said he "never was in that place" (Treblinka) and that his being brought to Israel to stand trial for his war time activities was "completely unfair."

Demjanjuk, a 65-year-old native of the Ukraine, denied having been a Nazi collaborator and added that he himself was held in a prison camp by the Nazis.

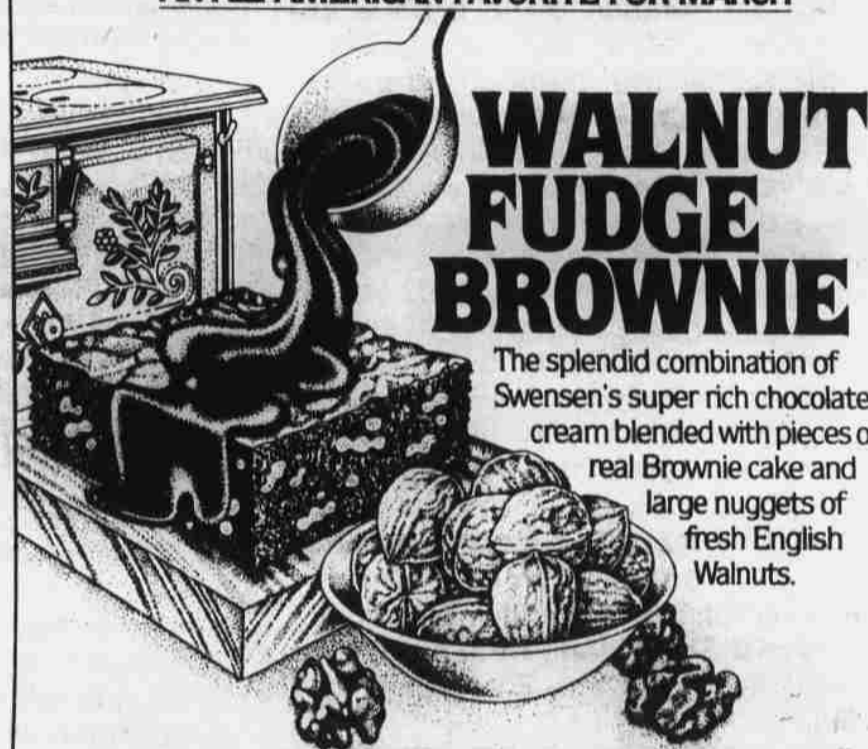

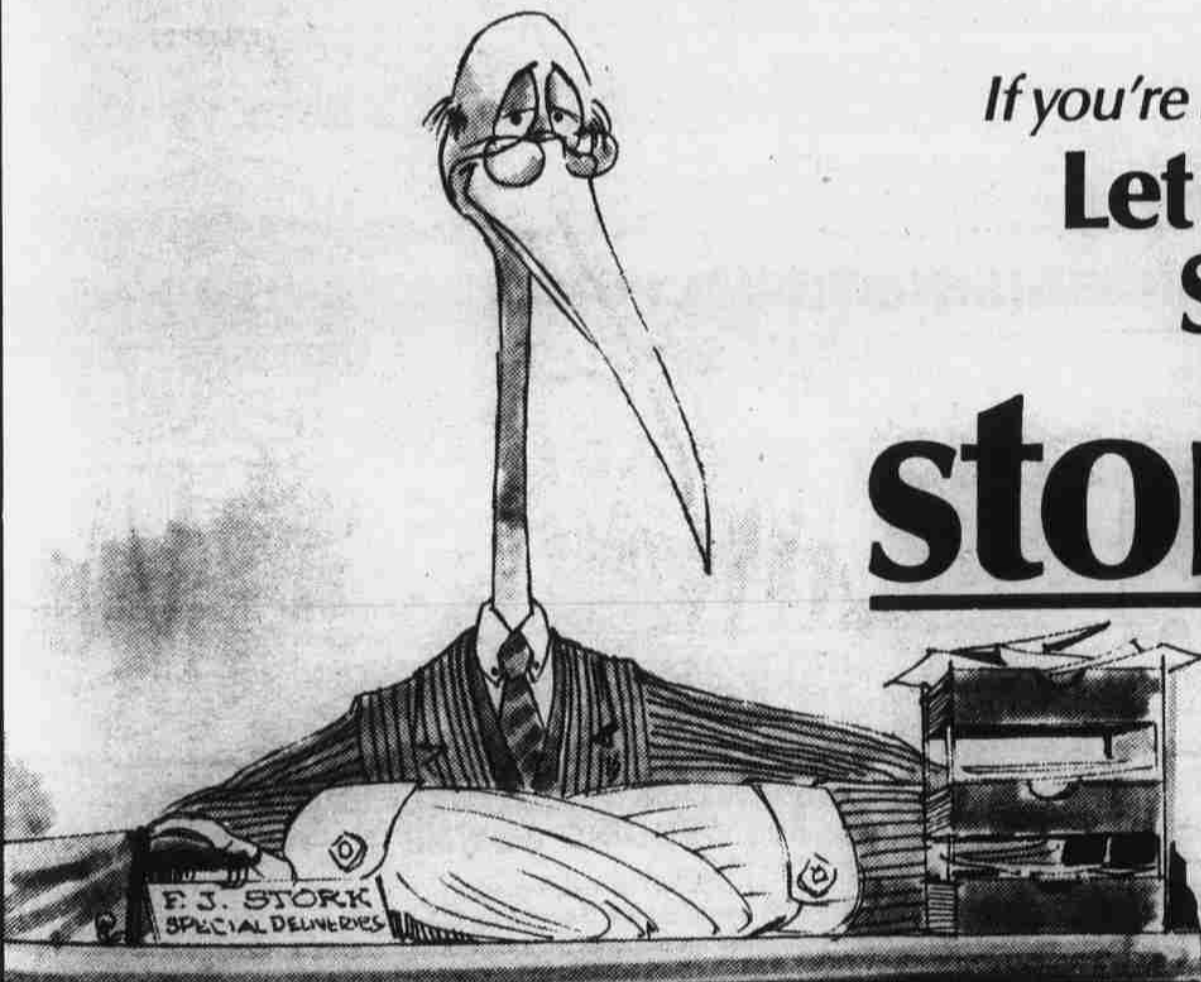
