Katyusha Rocket Injures Four In **Kiryat Shemona And IDF Retaliates**

TEL AVIV (WNS) -Three school children and a teacher of the Galilee town of Kirvat waere Shemona slightly injured when a Katyusha rocket landed in the middle of the town. Shortly afterwards IDF planes carried out bombing raids on two PLO installations southeast of south and Sidon in Lebanon.

The 122 mm. rocket landed in the courtyard of a school at 9:30 A.M. The wounded, who included three school children and a teacher, by flying glass, while had been sustained in
