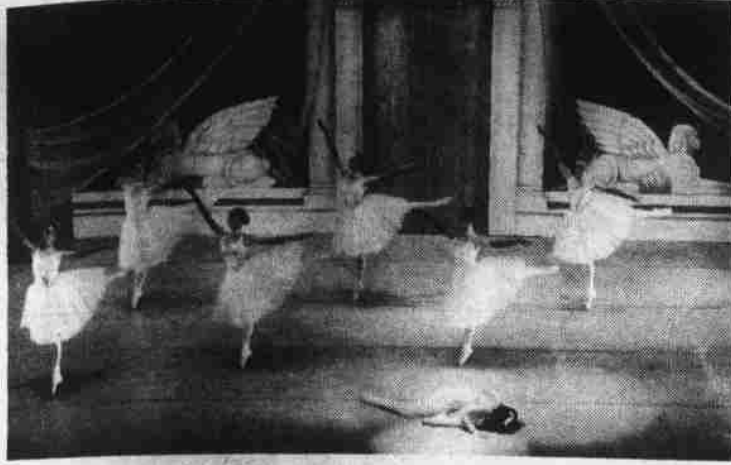


Nevada Dance Theatre Homecoming Program Closes Season



NEVADA DANCE THEATRE will present the final program of the 1985/86 season at the Artemus W. Ham Concert Hall on May 3 at 8 p.m. and May 4 at 2 p.m.

The dancers, recently returned from a highly successful tour of 44 cities in 18 western and mid-western states, have been in rehearsals for 5 weeks in preparation for this homecoming program.

Artistic Director, Vassili Sulich explained that, when he chooses the ballets for a mixed repertoire program such as this, a variety of dance style is always his first consideration to achieve maximum entertainment value.

The May program is no exception. Three ballets, each by a different choreographer, fulfill the goal of artistic diversity.

The evening begins with "CONCERTO GROSSO," by guest choreographer, Michael Czarny, whom NDT is bringing from Holland specifically for this project. Choreographed to Handel's 'Concerto Grosso,' the title is deceptive, because Czarny's modern ballet is a humorous take-off on sports and athletic activities. Parodies of boxing, skating, tightrope walking, and karate have kept audiences laughing in several cities around the world where this ballet has been performed.

In contrast, Sulich is restaging his dramatic classical ballet, "LA VALSE," premiered in 1982, to music by Maurice Ravel. Of his composition Ravel said, "La Valse" ... "a sort of apotheosis of the Viennese Waltz ... the mad whirl of some fantastic and fateful carousel."

Expanding upon this theme, Sulich's psychological drama is a girl's dream, turned nightmare, about unrequited love, jealousy and inferiority, which leads to her death - symbolically strangled by her bed sheets as she dreams.

New costumes have been designed and made by David Heuvel from Ballet West.

On the lighter side, "COLE," by guest choreographer, Wayne Soulant from the Metropolitan Ballet in Columbus, Ohio, closes the program. As the name indicates, a selection of famous songs by Cole Porter have been used to create an elegant, entertaining ballet, reminiscent of the Fred Astaire and Ginger Rogers movies. Long flowing gowns, tuxedos and a ballroom dancing style bring a touch of nostalgia to the program.

Guest artists will round out this program with two pas de deux.

More than half of the owners of the infamous auto filed into the hotel late Friday afternoon after caravanning through California to the luxurious hotel. Only 7,583 DeLoreans were produced at the Dunsmurry, Ireland plant, all of which were manufactured in 1981. During the one year, three automotive years (1981, 1982, & 1983) were brought off the assembly line. Of these cars, 6,918 vehicles have been accounted for and there are 5,372 confirmed owners throughout the United States, Canada, and in foreign countries. The sleek auto sold new for \$25-\$34,000 and has been sited in the 50th anniversary issue of **ROAD AND TRACK MAGAZINE** to be "one of the best collector's cars."

During their stay at the Imperial Palace, the DeLorean owners enjoyed the banquets prepared especially for them by the hotel's catering department, attended a technical seminar, and enjoyed a night at "Legends In Concert" in addition to touring the Imperial Palace's Antique & Classic Auto Collection and Restoration Shop.

Although there were approximately 50 DeLorean cars in attendance, over 100 DeLorean owners of the over 1,000 membership participated in the weekend festivities. Plans have already been confirmed for next year's rally to meet at the Imperial Palace during the first week in June.
