Sincere condolences to the family & friends of Lloyd Katz, the former owner of several Las Vegas movie theaters and a leader in civic and charity organizations, who died recently after a long illness.

Katz, 67, came to Las Vegas in 1951 and began operating the Fremont, Huntridge and Guild theaters. He later operated the Cinemas One Two Three theater on Fremont Street.

He quickly became a leader in the community and at various times served as director of the Downtown Progress Association, president of the Bluecoats, state chairman of the National Association of Theater Owners, co-chairman of the United Way and as a member of the University of Nevada Medical School Advisory Board.

He also was active in the Jewish community, serving as local chairman of the American Jewish Committee and as a charter member of B'nai B'rith. He was president of Temple Beth Sholom and helped plan the new temple building.

Katz was born February 10, 1919 in the Bronx, N.Y. He moved to San Francisco in 1941 and began working for a chain of movie theaters. He managed a film distributing company in San Francisco before family members urged him to move to Las Vegas.

In lieu of flowers, the family has requested that any donations be made to the Katz Memorial Lecture series, funded through the Las Vegas Jewish Federation. The lecture series will be a community program.

Katz, who died at the UCLA Medical Center, is survived by his wife, Edythe of Las Vegas; sons, Jeffrey of Los Angeles and Barry of Las Vegas; and a brother, Sidney Katz of Los Angeles.
