

Anatoly And Avital Shcharansky To Visit U.S. In May

Tel Aviv (WNS) — Anatoly and Avital Shcharansky are to visit the U.S. in May, despite reported threats from the Soviet Union that if they go, the current trickle of Soviet Jewish emigrants to Israel could be halted altogether. Shcharansky had earlier been reported to be going to the U.S. with Prime Minister Shimon Peres who left

on a four-day visit to New York and Washington. But the trip by the former Prisoner of Zion and Russian civil rights activist and his wife has been postponed until he completes urgent dental treatment, started a week earlier at a Hadassah Hospital Dental clinic in Jerusalem. His teeth deteriorated during his years in a Soviet labor camp. The Shcharanskys returned home a few days ago from a month-long vacation in northern Israel, and his dental treatment is expected to last some weeks.

couple are due to meet President Reagan in the White House and to receive a \$100,000 human rights award in Washington. They have also been invited to New York to meet with Mayor Edward Koch and to speak about Soviet Jewry before Jewish groups all over the country.

Friends of the Shcharanskys here say they will not bow to Soviet blackmail and forego their U.S. appearances because of Moscow threats to bar Jewish emigration if they made anti-Soviet propaganda.

Free Public Lecture At UNLV

Stanford University professor David Kennedy will examine immigration patterns in America society in a free public lecture April 25, 8 p.m. in the Green Room of Artemus W. Ham Concert Hall at UNLV.

Kennedy, author or co-author of seven books on American history, will discuss "The Present Status of Immigration and Its Historical Background."

His lecture is co-sponsored by UNLV and the Stanford Club of Southern Nevada.

Kennedy, who is also associate dean of the School of Humanities and Sciences at Stanford, is expected to draw parallels between the wave of immigrants now flowing into America -- the highest in the nation's history -- and immigration patterns of the past.

At Stanford since 1967, Kennedy has a Ph.D. from Yale University in American studies. His book, "Over Here: The First World War and American Society," was a Pulitzer Prize runner-up in history in 1981. He has also written about the Depression Era, the John F. Kennedy period and Margaret Sanger and the birth-control movement.

He is now working on a history of the United States covering the Depression and World War II.

Arabs Killed While Attacking Police Patrol

JERUSALEM (WNS) — An Arab youth was shot to death at the Al-Burj refugee camp in Gaza, after he threw a Molotov cocktail at a border police patrol. None of the policemen was hurt.

Security sources said the man threw the Molotov cocktail and ran away. The policemen chased him, warned him to stop, and when he ignored their warnings, he was shot to death. The Molotov cocktail blew up on the wall of a nearby school.

The event was seen as part of other sabotage attempts in the administered territories to mark Land Day
