Rabin Sees No Sign Of **Syria-Israel Military Confrontation**

TEL AVIV (WNS) -Defense Minister Yitzhak Rabin told U.S. Attorney General Edwin Meese, at a meeting at the Defense Ministry that there were no signs of a military confrontation between Israel and Syria.

Meese is in Israel on a week-long private visit, during which he has met with government leaders and lectured at Tel Aviv University.

United Nations observers have reported to U.N. headquarters in New York that the routine examination of both sides of the Israel-Syrian line in the Golan Heights unearthed no signs of any changes on the part of either

question whether the landing of Katyusha rockets in Galilee last week did not mean that the IDF would have to return to Lebanon in one way or another because security zone does not meet all the security needs, Drori replied: "Overall, the conception of the security of the northern border, including the existence of the zone security Lebanon, is proving itself, and even to a much greater extent than most people expected. Naturally it does not guarantee absolutely that no incident of any sort will take place, including the firing of Katyushas, as happened lately. If this situation changes dramatically, which is by all means possible, then additional steps will have to be taken in order to ensure quiet on the northern border," a Drori said.
