

Yom Hashoah Marked In Washington, Jerusalem And New York

the Austrian voters said "yes" to Kurt Waldheim, a man "alleged to have been an accomplice in the atrocities carried out by the Nazi army."

Sirens sounded all over Israel at noon the next day, bringing all activity to a halt for two minutes of silence in memory of the Holocaust victims. Schools devoted part of the day to discussions of the Holocaust. Rallies were held at night at Kibbutz Lohamri Hagetaot, where Premier Shimon Peres spoke and at Kibbutz Yad Mordechai.

At the Binyanei Haooama, the Jerusalem convention center, the final round of the international quiz on Jewish heroism during the Holocaust was held. The quiz, the first of its kind, was organized jointly by the Education Ministry, the World Zionist Organization and Histadrut.

Miriam Nocher, 17, of Argentina, won with 133 points, followed by Ada Weininger of Israel with 132. Reuven Zigler of New York was third and Asher Kravitz of Israel was fourth. Winners received scholarships, a special medal and a trip to Poland. A scholarship for one year of study in Israel was awarded to Dorotea Tennenblat of Warsaw, the only con-

testant from a Soviet bloc country.

In New York, John Cardinal O'Connor joined with Jewish community leaders May 6 in a ceremony at the Holocaust Memorial Wall across from the United Nations commemorating Yom Hashoah, the Day of Holocaust Remembrance.

O'Connor, the spiritual leader of nearly 2 million Catholics in the New York Archdiocese, spoke of the need to remember the suffering of the victims of Nazism, and recalled his visit to the Dachau death camp.

Reading an excerpt from "Liturgical Reflections on the Holocaust," prepared by Dr. Eugene Fisher, executive Secretary for Catholic-Jewish Relations of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops, and Rabbi Leon Klenicki, interfaith director of the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith, O'Connor said:

"Six million Jewish men and women, one million children among them, were taken by other human beings to die in gas and fire. Not only did Jews die ... millions of Poles, Gypsies, Russians and other Europeans also

ended their lives as victims of Nazism," O'Connor said. "But to be Jewish in Nazi Europe of itself meant annihilation and death."

However, O'Connor remarks appeared overshadowed by ADL director Nathan Perlmutter's strong attack on Kurt Waldheim, the former United Nations Secretary General, who is seeking to become Austria's next President.

Referring to Waldheim's activities as a Wehrmacht officer, Perlmutter said "Waldheim's lies about his past are not nearly so significant as Austria's polling booth approbation for his

lies." Perlmutter later suggested in his remarks that Jews "not depreciate the currency of the Holocaust by involving it too often, by speaking too readily, too indiscriminately, of Holocaust, of genocide."

The Yom Hashoah commemoration in New York, sponsored by the ADL, was held at the Holocaust Wall at Dag Hammarskjold Plaza. The Wall is a series of seven bronze bas-reliefs by sculptor Arbit Blatas depicting the Nazi degradation and slaughter of six million Jews. It was erected as a permanent outdoor memorial by the ADL.

Tunison and Weinstein drove the van to Detroit only to drive around the perimeter of the country after the 2,000-mile drive there., DiFrancesco flew to the starting point to meet up with his teammates. As of the time the Las Vegas medical team arrived at the Imperial Palace, they were in the top half of the vehicles participating.
