## Hebrew Academy Participates In National Scientific Balloon Launch

The Hebrew Academy students in Las Vegas joined with 175,000 other students in over 500 locations across the United States to launch helium-filled balloons, recently.

Sponsored by the Triangle Coalition for Science and Technology Education, the balloon launch is a nationwide science project which heralds the first school day of National Science Week.

From Maine to Hawaii and from Alaska to Texas, 175,000 students let go of their balloons at the same time (10:30 a.m. PDT, 11:30 a.m. MDT, 12:30 p.m. CDT, 1:30 p.m. EDT). Once aloft, each balloon's journey was determined by the altitude it reached and the prevailing winds.



name and the Hebrew Academy launch site were attached to each balloon requesting that the finder fill in where the balloon was found and mail the card to the National Center for Earch Science Education at the American Geological Institute (AGI) in Alexandria, Virginia.

Cards will then be distributed to post launch analysis centers. These centers will include seconardy school science teachers and students as analysts. After analysis, cards will be returned to the students who launched the balloons. The students will then participate in science class discussions related to air currents, weather maps and other earth science concepts.

Balloons in Nevada were supplied by (World-Book-Childcraft or E.I. DuPont de Nemours & Company). Originator and coordinator of the balloon launch, the Triangle Coalition for Science and Technology Education is composed of member organizations from business, industry, labor, science, engineering, medicine and science education, all of which are committed to the improvement of science education for all students.

National Science Week is sponsored by the National Science Foundation, Washington, D.C.


