Officials of the Clark County School District and Clark County Community College will ratify a formal agreement June 6, 8:30 a.m. at Community College to articulate electronics courses from high school through college. School Superintendent Bob Wentz and Community College President Paul Meacham will sign the joint agreement during a meeting of the Articulation Board.

Meda Braker, Helen J. Stewart School teacher aide, has been named Clark County Military Mother of the Year for 1986. The mother of a 17-year-old handicapped daughter, Braker is treasurer of the Coalition for Handicapped Children's Education.

Statistics released by the Clark County Health District may indicate that southern Nevadans do not place enough importance on proper diet and exercise.

Out of 778 persons who participated in an appraisal of health habits and lifestyle during the Health Fair in April, 77 percent indicated they do not eat a balanced diet and 65 do not participate in aerobic exercise even three times each week. Proper diet and exercise are important in nourishing the body and toning muscles and the circulatory system. Both are considered basic to maintaining good health and developing a strong immune system.

Good indicators from the study: less than one-quarter of the participants smoke, less than one-tenth use alcohol excessively and 95 percent monitor blood pressure at least once each year.

A health risk appraisal is useful before planning or beginning a new health program. In July, the Clark County Health District risk appraisal, analysis and counseling program will be available to anyone for \$5 through the health education office at the District Health Center, 625 Shadow Lane.
