WASHINGTON (WNS) official said both - President Reagan and King Hussein of Jordan agreed that unless there was progress in the Middle East toward peace the region could once again "drift" toward war.

But a senior Administration official, briefing reporters on the hour-long White House meeting indicated the situation was still as stalled as it has been since February when Hussein broke off efforts to work out a negotiating stance with the PLO.

Hussein, who last met with Reagan in September was in the United States to attend the high school graduation of his twin daughters and to get a physical checkup at a Cleveland hospital. After his meeting with Reagan, he had lunch with Vice President George Bush and then met with Secretary of State George Shultz, **Defense Secretary Cas**par Weinberger and other senior U.S. officials.


