## Israel Reaction To Waldheim Election

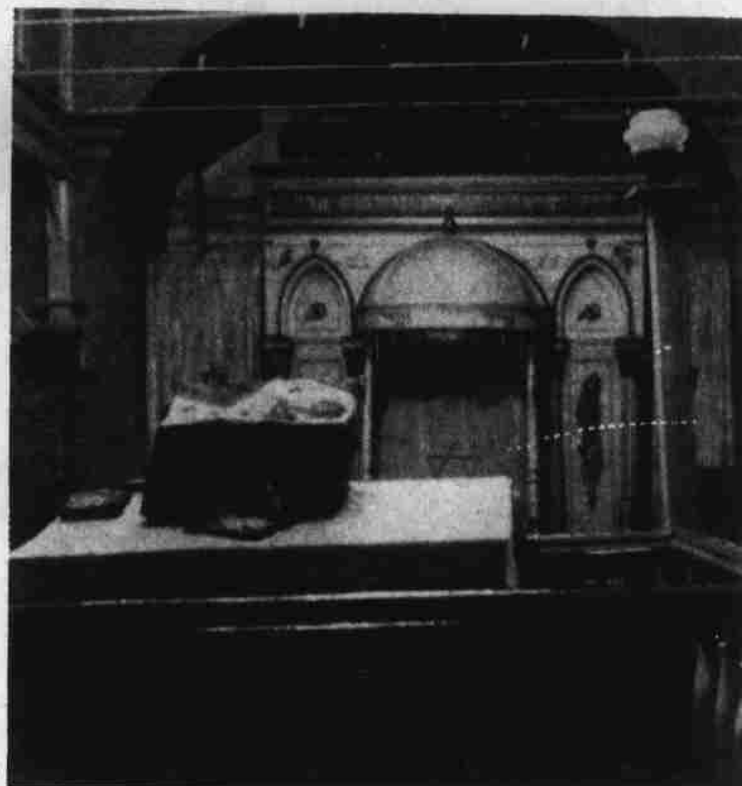
JERUSALEM (WNS) — Premier Shimon Peres said that the election of Kurt Waldheim to the Presidency of Austria is less a problem of Israel's relations with Austria than it is a problem of "Austria's relations with itself" and "with its past."

In a televised speech, Peres said, "from my point of view the problem is not whether Waldheim was elected or not. What really worries me is the background, the accompaniment of his election. This accompaniment and background were not lacking in anti-Semitic characteristics."

Waldheim, elected with an eight percent margin -- a landslide in terms of past Austrian Presidential elections -- has been accused of war crimes and there is a growing body of evidence indicating that he was at least indirect-

ly involved in atrocities against Yugoslav partisans and the deportation of Greek Jews when he served as a Wehrmacht intelligence officer in the Balkans during World War II.

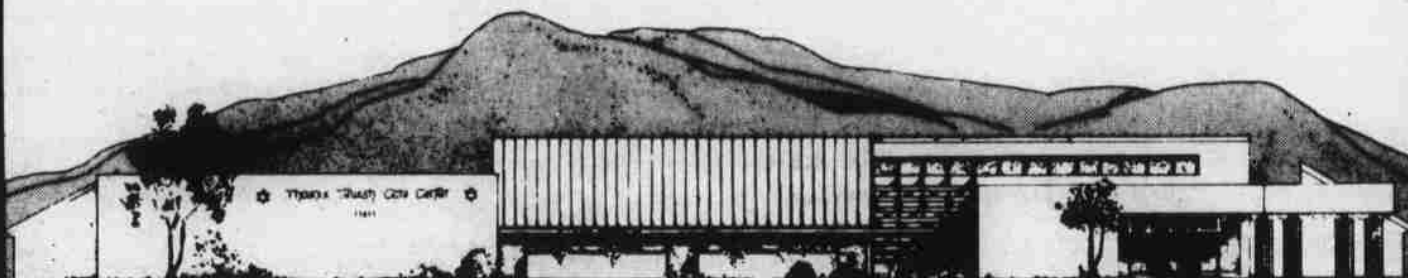
