## Annual Meeting Of Tucker Automobile Owners At Imperial Palace Hotel & Casino

A very exclusive group of automobile owners congregated at the Imperial Palace Hotel & Casino in June. They are owners of Tuckers, one of the most controversial cars ever built.

Only 51 cars were ever assembled at the Chicago plant leased by Preston Tucker. They were all produced in 1948.

The Tucker was ahead of its time. The car had a central headlight that turned with the front wheels, a "safety dashboard" with instruments and controls grouped under the steering wheel, and several other safety and convenience features that were radically new.

After completing only 51 cars, Tucker was forced out of business by a Securities and Exchange Commission fraud investigation. Although Preston Tucker was found not guilty, the public had lost all faith in his ideas. Whether or not fraud played any part in the demise of the Tucker is still controversial.

Last year's convention (also at the Imperial Palace in Las Vegas) brought nine Tuckers and 100 devotees of the auto together. It was said to be the most Tuckers lined up fender-to-fender since 1948 in Preston Tucker's Chicago factory.

Of the 51 Tuckers built, 48 are still viable, occasionally changing hands at auctions for as much as \$100,000. The other three have been traced by the Tucker Automobile Club of America and it was found that one was hit by a train, one was lost in a fire, and one is in Brazil (owner unknown). The one that was "lost in a fire," Serial No. 23, wasn't really lost. The owner has the pieces in Orange Park, FL., and he's going to rebuilt it.

Tuckers brought by their owners to the convention were on display in a special annex to the Imperial Palace Auto Collection which features antique and classic autos. It is located on the fifth floor of the hotel's parking facility. Also on display was the Tucker with Serial No. 8 which is part of the Imperial Palace's famous collection. The auto collection has more than 200 autos on display and is open daily from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30

Membership in the Tucker Automobile Club is open to anyone who is interested. One need not own a Tucker to join the club to to have attended the convention at the Imperial Palace.
