

**Peres Vows To Continue To Seek Dialogue With Jordan**

NEW YORK (WNS) — Premier Shimon Peres vowed that despite obstacles, Israel will continue to seek ways "to establish a dialogue with Jordan" that would lead to a peaceful agreement between the two countries. Addressing more than 1,200 Jewish leaders from the U.S., Canada, Europe and Latin America who attended an Israel Bonds gala dinner here marking the 100th anniversary of the birth of David Ben Gurion, Peres, in an address via satellite from Jerusalem, said that Israel "is trying very much to establish a dialogue with Jordan" and stressed that despite the difficulties "We should never lose hope" that eventually Jordan and Israel will meet for direct, face to face, peace negotiations.

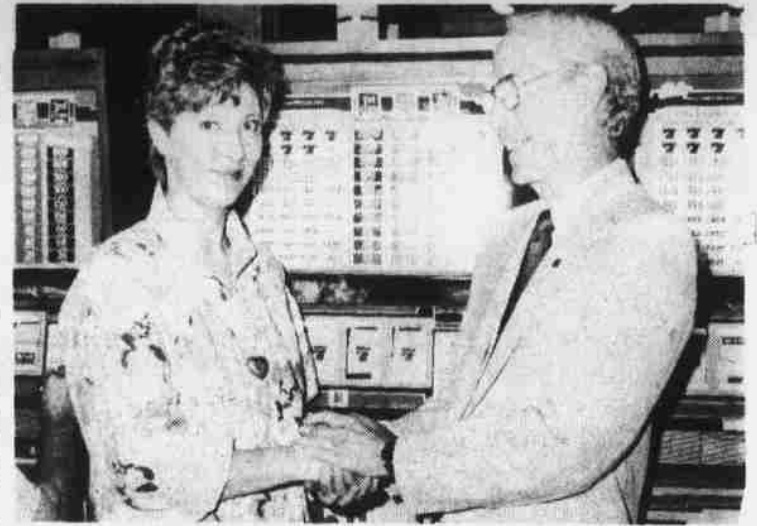
Peres said that Israel hopes that once its differences with Egypt are ironed out and negotiations between the two countries over the Taba territory near Eilat are concluded, the peace efforts can be concentrated between Israel and Jordan. He noted that Israel has changed its settlement policy in the West Bank and has been working continuously to improve the standard of living of the Palestinians in that area.

The Israeli leader said that his country is trying to reduce tension with Syria, stressing that Israel is not interested in escalating its relations with Syria. Peres also said that Israel will completely withdraw from Lebanon and remove its remaining troops in the "security zone" in south Lebanon, once it is absolutely assured that there is no danger to Israeli settlements in the north.

In paying tribute to Ben Gurion, Israel's first Prime Minister and one of its founders, Peres said that the vision of Ben Gurion, to ingather the Jews of the world in Israel and make Israel strong to enable her to reach peace, is still valid today. He called on world Jewry to continue its "partnership" with Israel and help the Jewish State to achieve peace and economic independence.

Mayor Teddy Kollek of Jerusalem, who played a leading role in the founding of Israel Bonds told the Jewish leaders that Jerusalem, Israel's capital "will never be divided again."
