Nazi Loses Citizenship

Israeli Wheelchair Basketball Team Meets Pope

PHILADELPHIA (WNS) — A three-judge federal panel ordered that a Lithuanian-born man accused of participating in Nazi atrocities against Jews, Juozas Kungys, be stripped of his United States citizenship.

The panel of the United States Court of Appeals for the Third District, said that Kungys, of Clifton, N.J., made material misrepresentations about his background when he immigrated in 1948 and obtained citizenship in 1954.

The ruling rejected a lower court's verdict in
