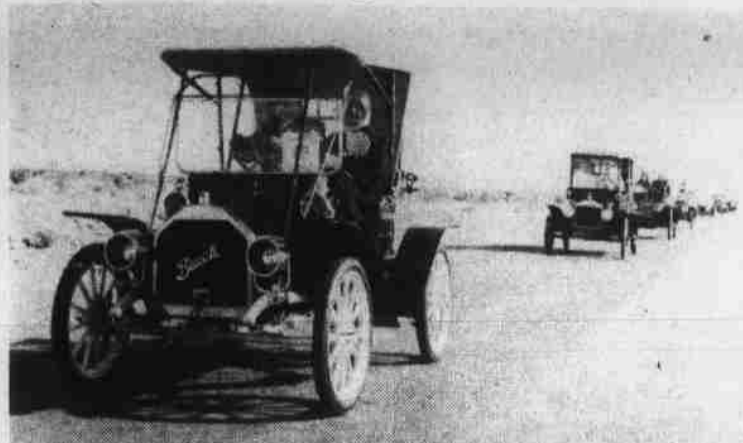


Imperial Palace Hotel & Casino To Hold Fifth Annual Antique Auto Run

This year, approximately 450 antique autos, all built prior to 1937, will be participating in the festivities of the Imperial Palace's Fifth Annual Antique Auto Run Oct. 24-26, 1986.

The Fifth Annual Imperial Palace Antique Auto Run scheduled for October 24 - 26, 1986, promises to be the biggest and most exciting Auto Run yet. In 1982, when the First Annual Auto Run took place, there were only 60 cars entered; in 1983 entries increased to 120; and in the third year there was another increase to 234. In October, 1985, 300 beautiful, gleaming antique autos joined our now-famous caravan. We expect to meet or surpass that number for the 1986 Auto Run.

The weekend will be full of festivities beginning with a "get-acquainted" cocktail party on Friday evening where old friendships can be renewed and where new participants can meet. On Saturday morning, the Auto Run will begin when Johnny Jay's marching band kicks off the event.

Caravaning motorists driving vehicles made prior to 1937 will travel through the Valley of Fire State Park and along the scenic shore of Lake Mead to Boulder Beach where cast members of "Legends in Concert" will perform live recreations of Elvis Presley, Marilyn Monroe, Hank Williams and other legendary performers in a special show. Also contributing to the afternoon's entertainment will be Johnny Jay's Ragtime Band playing sing-a-long songs and your ragtime favorites. The costumes and antique autos will make Boulder Beach look as though the clocks were turned back 60 years.

A lavish barbecue will be served at the gala outdoor event catered by the Imperial Palace's excellent chefs followed by the Awards Ceremony. Special awards will be given for the entrant that traveled the farthest, for best theme, and the best costume.

The Antique Auto Run will then continue their scenic trip through the colorful Nevada desert back to the Imperial Palace Hotel.

After resting from a full day's activities, participants will gather later Saturday evening for an elaborate reception with cocktails and an enormous array of hors d'oeuvres including ham, turkey, and a steamship round of beef with dancing to the sounds of music popular from the turn of the century to the swing era. The dress for the evening will be everything from high-button shoes to flapper dresses.
