TEL AVIV (WNS) — A woman tourist from Canada was among five relatives killed in a road accident on the Negev road to Eilat. She was identified as Leanne Ochiyon but further details, including her home town and age, were not immediately available.

Also killed in the accident were her aunt, Ita Ochiyon, 38, and her three cousins Sagit, 14, Ariella, 12, and Shani, 5. Her uncle Albert Ochiyon, 40, with whom she had been visiting at their home in Beersheba, who had been driving their car at the time of the accident, was injured and is hospitalized.

Police said the car appeared to have swerved off the roadway, hit the side of a road culvert and fallen some 10 feet into a ditch, where it burst into flames.

The accident was the latest in a series of road accidents the same week, in which over a score of people were killed and many more injured.

Police said there did not appear to be any specific linking or common reason for the sudden spate of fatal road accidents - apart from the heat wave and the narrow roads.

I guess I could answer as so many do, that we who have gained so much from this community owe an obligation to give something back. And that would be true. But I guess the real reason is that I'm my Father's son.
