

Judge William D. Jansen Seeks Re-Election



Judge William D. Jansen has announced he will seek another term as Justice of the Peace. Jansen was appointed by the Clark County Commission to Department V of the Clark County Justice Court on July 2, 1985. A long time resident of Las Vegas, Judge Jansen received his Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice from Michigan State University in 1958, and was awarded his Juris Doctorate Degree in Law from Drake University in 1962.

Jansen's appointment to the bench climaxed an outstanding career in law enforcement spanning over 23 years of service with the F.B.I.

Since his appointment to the bench, Jansen has been noted as a stern but fair jurist, administering justice tempered with compassion. He has been labeled as a "No-Nonsense Judge" and a strong advocate of law and order.

Judge Jansen is married, and he and his wife, Nora, are the proud parents of two sons, Michael and Paul. Jansen is active in numerous civic and charitable organizations here in Southern Nevada, as well as the Clark County Bar Association.

Will Deiss Seeks Office Of Constable



Will Deiss seeks the Office of Constable, Las Vegas Township, a post he had held in 1979 and 1980.

Deiss is a 30-year veteran in law enforcement having worked with the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department, Chief City Marshall, Constable and Hotel Security Chief.

He has attended schools at California Poly, University of Nevada, Las Vegas and Eastern Illinois.

"During my tenure as the Constable, all my deputies were trained in fire arms procedure and had to qualify with their weapons.

"We also required the deputies to attend 36 hours of classes each year in Law Enforcement Procedures relating to their job. These classes were sponsored by Cal State University and UNLV and each deputy received two college credits.

"All deputies were required to be trained in pulmonary recessitation. These life support procedures were repeated each year." Deiss stated.

"I am quite proud of our record in the constables office as we were responsible for serving over 90% of the papers that were handled by that office."

For this office to function properly and successfully, it must be returned to these standards and it will be a profitable department again.

Deiss has been active in the community for 33 years and is a member of the Kentucky Colonels, Saints and Sinners, Elks Lodge and Past President of the Nevada Constables Association, Retired Public Employees Association, Breakfast Exchange Club and the Las Vegas Police Officers Union.

Joan L. Swift Seeks Re-Election As Clark County Recorder



Clark County Recorder Joan L. Swift, a Democrat, is seeking re-election for a fourth term in office.

Swift has been responsible for many innovations in her 11 years as Recorder. Her computerized indexing system won an Achievement Award from the National Association of Counties in 1982. An on-line computerized recordation system currently under development will enable her office to continue keeping pace with the growth of the county.

The volume of recordings, in addition to other requests for services, has grown in direct proportion to Clark County's population. Since first taking office in 1975, Swift has seen the volume of recordings more than double (112% increase), while her staff has decreased by one. She has automated most functions to manage this growth, and is seeking a fourth term in office to continue the development of the on-line recordation system in order to provide the best service possible, with available resources, to the people of Clark County.

Swift is a member of the Women's Democratic Club of Clark County; the National Association of County Recorders and Clerks; member and past president of County Fiscal Officers Association of Nevada; and serves on the Clark County Ethical Standards Committee.

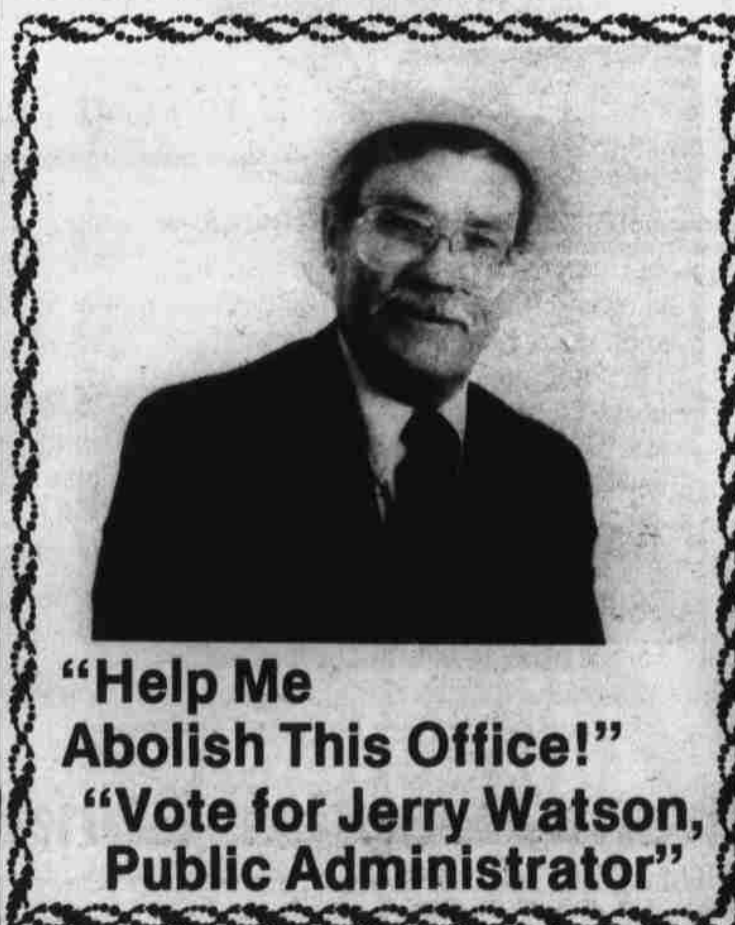
