Three Of World's Top Jewish Leaders To Confer At B'nai B'rith International Convention August 24 - 29 In Las Vegas

Three influential international Jewish leaders will confer on major issues affecting Israel and the rest of the world's Jewish community during B'nai B'rith International's convention in Las Vegas, Aug. 24-29.

The three are Gerald Kraft, president of B'nai B'rith, Edgar Bronfman, president of the World Jewish Congress; and Arye Dulzin, chairman of both the Jewish Agency and the World Zionist Organization.

B'nai B'rith is the world's oldest and largest Jewish service organization while both the Jewish Congress and the Zionist Organization are large umbrella bodies. B'nai B'rith stresses the combating of anti-Semitism at the United Nations, while the World Jewish Congress recently exposed the Nazi background of former UN Secretary General and current Austrian President, Kurt Waldheim. In effect, all three organizations seek to intensify the ties between Israelis and Jews elsewhere in the world. B'nai B'rith and the WJC also aim at unifying the world's Jewish population, encouraging the further development of the Judaic religion and culture fighting racial bigotry, and guaranteeing human rights for everyone.

Over the past year, both Kraft and Bronfman have met with political leaders of numerous nations, including the United States, the Soviet Union, South Africa, West Germany, and Argentina. In every instance they discussed human rights, anti-Semitism, anti-racism, and Middle Eastern peace.

Dulzin, on the other hand, concentrates on the welfare of Jews -- especially immigrants -- in Israel. As head of the Jewish Agency, he directed the program of absorption of Ethiopian and Soviet Jews.

All three leaders will address the B'nai B'rith convention. Kraft will give the State of the Order, Bronfman will discuss Soviety Jewry and Dulzin will speak about the future of Zionism.

Some 1,800 delegates and their spouses, representing 43 nations, are expected to attend the convention.


