Since Nevada law requires school children to be up-to-date on their immunizations, now is a good time to check your child's immunization records and get those booster shots.

Children who haven't been completely immunized against childhood disease are at risk of contracting the seven serious, and sometimes deadly diseases -- measles, German measles, polio, mumps, diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus. Clark County Health District officials report that with the exception of tetanus, these diseases are highly contagious and spread rapidly.

If you haven't checked your child's immunization records lately, compare your records to the schedule provided by the Clark County Health District.

If your child needs a booster, immunizations are available from physicians or Clark County Health District clinics. Public health clinics are open Monday through Friday at three locations: 625 Shadow Lane, Las Vegas; 102 E. Lake Mead Drive, Henderson and 3262 Civic Center Drive, North Las Vegas. The Las Vegas clinic is open 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.; hours for the Henderson clinic are 8:30 a.m. to noon and 12:30 p.m. to 4 p.m. The North Las Vegas clinic is open 9 a.m. to noon and 12-30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Immunization at public health clinics is provided without charge and no appointment is necessary. Parents should bring immunization records to the clinic. Records must be checked prior to immunization.

As a convenience to parents, the immunization clinic on Shadow Lane in Las Vegas is open each Monday in August until 6:30 p.m.

Absentee voting for the September 2nd Primary Election will continue through August 26th, at the office of the Clark County Election Department, 400 Las Vegas Boulevard South. This means of in-office absentee voting is made available for those people who will not be in town on Election Day and will not be at any permanent address sufficiently long enough to receive an absentee ballot by mail.

Requests for mail-out absentee ballots are currently being accepted at the Clark County Election Department and will be accepted through August 26th, one week prior to Election Day. After August 26th, absentee voting will be restricted, by law, to those people who, due to some emergency, will be unable to go to the polls. The provisions for absentee ballot requests will extend through 5:00 P.M. on Election Day, September 2nd. It is important that all absentee voters be aware that their voted ballots must be returned to the Clark County Election Department no later than 7:00 P.M. on Election Day for them to be counted. Ballots received after that time, cannot, by law, be counted.
