Report Shows Slight Decline In International Terrorism

TEL AVIV (WNS) — A slight decline in international terrorist incidents was reported in 1985, from 412 the previous year to 408 last year, according to Inter 85, the latest review of international terrorism published by Tel Aviv University Jaf-fee Center for Strategic Studies just published.

There is likely to be some controversy about the project's definition of international terrorism. The researchers chose to exclude in the compilation of terrorist activities any attacks carried out by a dissident or guerrilla group on its home territory against any foreign or outside force.

The report does not cover incidents against Soviet troops in Afghanistan, against American troops in

Latin America, or against the IDF in Southern Lebanon. The review also does not cover activities of the Irish Republican Army (IRA) against British or Northern Ireland forces in Ulster, or activities carried out by the Jewish Defense League (JDL) against Arabs in the U.S., on the grounds that these were acts of American Jews against American Arabs.

The 1985 review says that the most common tactic last year, as in the previous year, was bombing and arson, accounting for 40 percent of all terrorist incidents. Armed assaults, including murder, constituted 20.6 percent (32.2 percent in 1984), followed, in order of frequency, by abductions - 13.2 percent, aircraft and ship hijacking - 2.2 percent (including the Achille Lauro incident.)

Western Europe was the arena in which 44.7 percent of all international terrorist incidents took place in 1985 (as against 40.5 percent in 1984). It was followed by Latin America with 19.8 percent, and the Middle East -- 17.2 percent.

Sixty-four different organizations were active during 1985 on the international terrorist scene, but about half of all incidents were carried out by only a dozen or so organizations. The most active of these were Middle Eastern groups -- Palestinian organizations accounted for 17.2 percent of all incidents (some 70 incidents, of which 24 were executed by Abu Nidal) and 14 percent of all incidents were carried out by radical Shiite groups.
