

> Western Europe was the arena in which 44.7 percent of all inter-



national terrorist incidents took place in 1985 (as against 40.5 percent in 1984). It was followed by Latin America with 19.8 percent, and the Middle East -- 17.2 percent.

Sixty-four different organizations were active during 1985 on the international terrorist scene, but about half of all incidents were carried out by only a dozen or SO organizations. The most active of these were Middle Eastern groups -- Palestinian organizations accounted for 17.2 percent of all incidents (some 70 incidents, of which 24 were executed by Abu Nidal) and 14 percent of all incidents were carried out by radical Shiite groups.
