Mozart On Fifth One Performance Only Charleston Heights Arts Center September 20



The fabulous MOZART ON FIFTH trio plays the music America loves at 8 p.m., Saturday, September 20 at the Charleston Heights Arts Center, 800 S. Brush.

Renowned for their versatility and engaging showmanship, this trio of virtuoso wind players are part of a hot new trend -- a chamber ensemble that plays everything from Bach to the Beatles. Their brilliant musicianship, virtuoso performances, and warm, lively audience rapport have earned them rave reviews from critics and audiences all across America.

Buddy "Cruise Control" Goldfarb (clarinet, alto sax, flute, vocals), Cash Kelley (clarinet,

If you're wondering what's in a name, MOZART ON FIFTH began playing Mozart on the corner of Fifth Avenue and 56th Street in New York City. Discovered by Allan Jaffe, the founder of Preservation Hall, while serenading enraptured listeners at New Orleans' Mardi Gras, they have crisscrossed the country playing concert halls, colleges, music festivals, community concerts, cabarets and clubs.

Return engagements at the New Orleans Jazz and Heritage Festival, Virginia's Wolf Trap and the Chautauqua Institution, a feature spot on Garrison Keillor's "Prairie Home Companion" radio program, and most recently, a guest appearance on the Today Show "Stars of Tomorrow" series highlighting the finest musical ensembles in the nation, have brought MOZART ON FIFTH to the forefront of the American musical scene.


