inadmissible act. If those who fight in order to secure the rights which were taken away from them in the process of history, think that they will fulfill their aims this way, they are making a big mistake.

In Paris, thousands of people marched through the streets to protest the Istanbul synagogue massacre and demand that the nations of the world take the strongest possible action against terrorism. The marchers chanted "Syria and Libya accomplices" and urged world opinion to back a policy of armed resistance to terrorists and never to give in to their demands.

Marchers included Socialist and Gaullist political leaders and members of Parliament. In Los Angeles, Mayor Tom Bradley denounced the attack as "the vicious, unprovoked and unwarranted massacre of people peacefully praying to their god." He spoke before some 500 people who joined in a memorial service for the 21 victims. The event was sponsored by the Simon Wiesenthal Center and Yeshiva University of Los Angeles. Bradley observed that "there is no ideology or cause which could ever justify such brutality."
