

## Julio Iglesias Returns Unto Caesars



Julio Iglesias, who has been called the world's number one musical ambassador, returns to Caesars Palace Circus Maximus Showroom October 8-13 with comedienne Roseanne Barr.

Continuing a North American tour that ends in October, Julio has many record-breaking live concert appearances to his credit. His 10-day engagement at L.A.'s Universal Amphitheatre during the 1984 Olympics amassed \$1.7 million in ticket sales. Engagements in Houston, Albuquerque and Denver prompted the mayors of those cities to herald his arrival with "Julio Iglesias Day" proclamations. The list goes on and on.

Julio is the only recipient of the Guinness Book of World Records Diamond Disc award, presented in 1983 for his 965 gold and 350 platinum records worldwide.

With his first English album, "1100 Bel Air Place," Julio stepped into the heart of American pop music. Its hit single "To All the Girls I've Loved Before," a duet with Caesars star Willie Nelson, topped country, pop and adult contemporary charts. ## AJC Outraged Over Violent Terrorist Acts In France

NEW YORK — The American Jewish Committee expressed its "deep feelings of shock and outrage" over the violent terrorist acts of recent weeks in France.

In a letter to President Francois Mitterrand, Theodore Ellenoff, AJC President, commented: "It is both ironic and tragic that France, which has exemplified the tradition of political asylum, should have been so cruelly repaid by such criminal acts of destruction."

Mr. Ellenoff told the French President that the human relations agency wished to associate itself with "the forceful statements" that the French Government had made in condemning terrorism and in calling for effective countermeasures. "Such sentiments," he added, "are not only paralleled by the policies of our American Government, they are shared by the overwhelming majority of the American people, who have only contempt for such inhuman and savage destruction of lives."

## Barclay Shaw Joins "Splash"

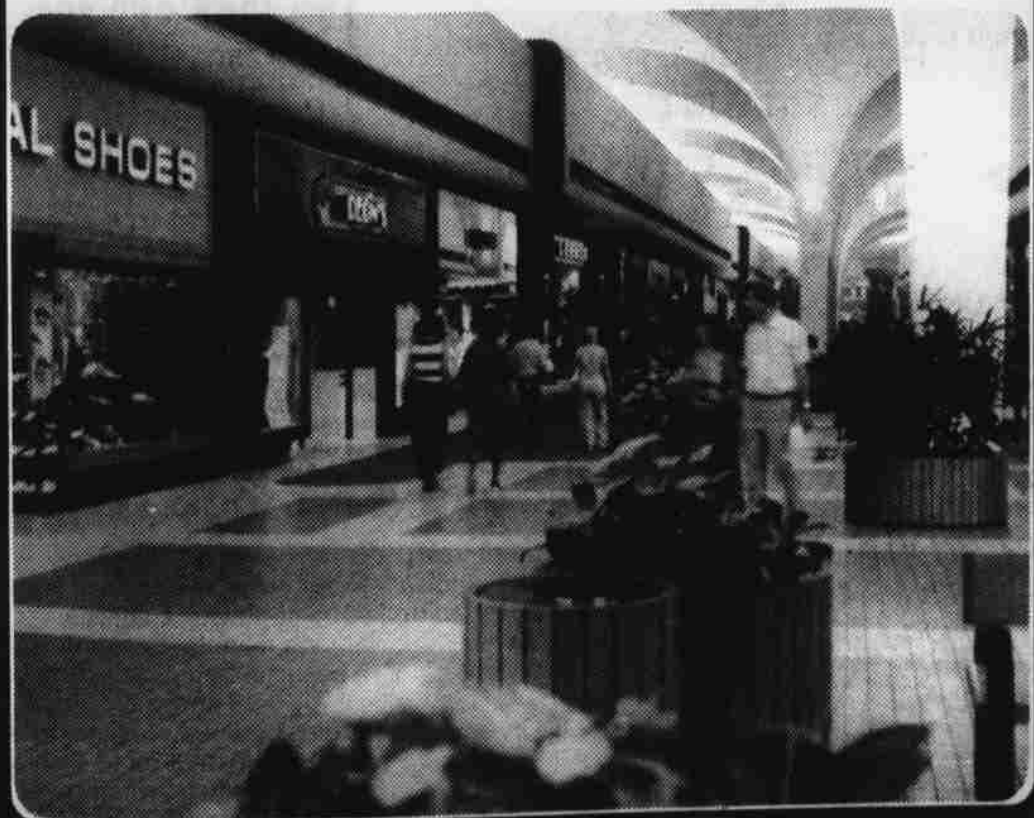
