24 hours a day, 365 days a year, Community Action Against Sexual Assault stands ready to serve Clark County's victims of sexual assault; men, women and children. CAASA's victims range from a 3 week old baby, to a 30 year old man, to an 82 year old woman.

Their major fundraiser, "Run For Your Rights" takes place on Saturday, October 11, 8:00 A.M. at Lion's Park. This event features a 2 and a 5 mile run and a 1 mile "Walk in the Park." This event benefits child and adult victims of sexual assault. Community Action Against Sexual Assault supplies a 24-hour hotline; hospital, law enforcement and court accompaniment; advocacy with private and government agencies; assistance in filing for county and state victim compensation and public awareness on prevention and intervention through lectures, literature and the media. So far in 1986, they assisted 380 victims, their families and friends. Almost half of their clients (48%) are less than 18 years old.
