
Page Thirty-Six Happy New YSap Las Vegas Israelite Trevor Berbick Vs. Mike Tyson November 22 - Las Vegas Hilton

World Boxing Council heavyweight champion Trevor Berbick defends his title against undefeated slugger Mike Tyson in a 12-round bout November 22 at the Las Vegas Hilton it was announced by John Giovenco, President of Hilton Nevada Corporation, and Don King and Butch Lewis of Dynamic Duo, Inc.

The title fight matches Berbick, an underrated champion who has steadily climbed to the top of the boxing world, against the 20-year-old Tyson, who is attempting to become the youngest person to win a world heavyweight crown.

The fight, the fifth in the eight-bout unification heavyweight World Series, will take place in the 8,500-seat Hilton Center on Saturday, November 22.

"We're excited to host this potentially historymaking title fight," said Giovenco. "Barbick has shown he's a fine champion, and Tyson will be trying to do something no one ever has in winning a world championship at age 20.

"This reaffirms the Hilton's commitment to



The native of Jamaica, now living in Miami, Fla., stands 6-foot-2-1/2 inches, three inches taller than Tyson, and has a 78-inch reach, seven more than the challenger.

Tyson, from Catskill, N.Y., has a record of 27-0 with 25 knockouts, and is coming off a most impressive second-round knockout of former WBC cruiserweight champion Alfonzo Ratliff on September 6 at the Hilton.

If Tyson wins he'll be the world heavyweight champion at 20 years, four months. Currently the youngest person to win the coveted title is Floyd Patterson, who did it in 1956 at the age of 21, just five weeks short of his 22nd birthday.

The winner between Berbick and Tyson on November 22 is schedule to meet the winner of the upcoming Tim Witherspoon-Tony Tubbs World Boxing Association title fight.

Tickets are now on sale for the Trever Berbick-Mike Tyson World Boxing Council heavyweight championship card Saturday, November 22, at the Las Vegas Hilton.

Tickets, ranging in price from \$75 to \$600, are on sale seven days a week from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Hilton Special Events Ticket Office, located in the lobby of the hotel.

Berbick always has risen to the occasion. He was the first to extend Larry Holmes to 15 rounds in a championship bout and was the first to defeat then world-ranked and highly regarded Greg Page. And he was the last person to defeat the legendary three-time world champion Muhammad Ali.
