Two Arab Terrorists Sentenced For Bombing West Berlin Club

WEST BERLIN (WNS) — A West Berlin Court sentenced two Jordanian nationals to prison term for bombing the German-Arab Friendship Club here

last March and ordered the arrest of a Syrian Embassy intelligence officer as an accomplice.

The court sentenced Ahmed Hasi, 35, to 14 years imprisonment and Farouk Salameh, 40, to 13 years. Hasi is the brother of Nezar Hindawi who was convicted in a London court last month and sentenced to 45 years in prison for attempting to smuggle explosives aboard an El Al airliner at Heathrow Airport last April 17.

Presiding Judge Hans Joachim Heinze issued a warrant for the arrest of Haythem Saed, a high ranking Syrian intelligence of-

ficer after finding evidence of Syrian complicity in the bombing. He said the evidence was based on the pre-trial confessions by the two convicted terrorists and "there is nothing to suggest that these confessions were anything but genuine."

In their confessions, Hasi and Salameh said they were recruited by Hindawi and were given the bomb by Saed at the Syrian Embassy. Saed, also known as Abu Ahmed, was implicated at Hindawi's trial where he was identified as deputy chief of Syrian Air Force intelligence.

A West German

Justice Ministry official said the government would study the sentences and draw the necessary conclusions, apparently a reference to Syrian involvement.

The Arab League meanwhile warned the Bonn government against taking diplomatic or other measures against any of its member states. They mentioned Syria as a possible target of diplomatic retaliation.

Evidence produced at Hindawi's trial in London led the British government to break diplomatic relations with Syria. British Foreign Secretary Sir Geoffrey Howe urged Britain's European Economic Community (EEC) partners to follow suit, or at least recall their Ambassadors from Damascus. Howe also pressed for severe economic and other sanctions against Syria. The EEC Ministers agreed to end arms sales to Syria and took several other restrictive measures against Syria. But they are not likely to have more than nuisance value. It remains to be seen how the West German government acts in light of the court's finding that Syria was implicated in the March bombing.

A day after the court implicated Syrian officials in the bombing, West Germany ordered three Syrian diplomats expelled and downgraded its relations with Syria.
